Subject:	First 10 recruits celebrate week at Computershare's latest Global Technology Centre in Edinburgh

Edinburgh, Monday 4 September 2017 – The first 10 recruits at Computershare's latest Global Technology Centre (GTC) have celebrated one week in their new roles, marking a "new chapter" for financial services in Edinburgh, the company has announced.

The new starters come from a variety of backgrounds, with Scottish and European staff members joining graduates of Edinburgh's universities and those already working in

financial services and joiners from other industries – as well as staff members with IT experience and those new to technology.
